Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend, we welcome Mr. Charles Cappelli, a seminarian in the Theology III class at Saint Charles Borromeo seminarian, preparing for ordination for our Archdiocese. I have known Charlie since I was a seminarian assigned to the Temple Newman Center when he was a senior. After graduating, he spent some years as a FOCUS missionary before entering the seminary. Father Bob and I agree that he will make a fine priest in just a few short years. Welcome, Charlie, and thanks for sharing your story and reminding us of the importance of the annual seminary appeal!

On December 6th, we will have a First Friday evening celebration with adoration beginning at 5:30 pm in the church and concluding with benediction at 6:15, followed by Mass at 6:30 pm. Confessions will be available during the holy hour, and a social will follow in the hall after. Speaking of First Friday and devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, did you know that Pope Francis released a new encyclical last month called Dilexit Nos on the Sacred Heart? It is a powerful document, and I hope we can organize discussion groups to read it. Here is one quote from the conclusion: "In a world where everything is bought and sold, people's sense of their worth appears increasingly to depend on what they can accumulate with the power of money. We are constantly being pushed to keep buying, consuming, and distracting ourselves, held captive to a demeaning system that prevents us from looking beyond our immediate and petty needs. The love of Christ has no place in this perverse mechanism, yet only that love can set us free from a mad pursuit that no longer has room for a gratuitous love. Christ's love can give a heart to our world and revive love wherever we think that the ability to love has been definitively lost."

The Gospel of John relates that Jesus engaged in an extended discourse with his Apostles on the night before his death. He had called them and formed them for all that time, but now he was beginning his journey back to the Father from whom he had come. He promised not to leave them orphans, assuring them that "the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and assure you of all that I told you" (John 14:26).

There are whispers of the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament. Literally, the very first verse of the Bible speaks of a "mighty wind" (in Hebrew, "ruah") that swept across the primeval waters just as God says, "Let there be light" (Gen 1:1). When Abraham greets three angels, he recognizes them to be emissaries of God himself, an Old Testament prefiguration of the Trinity, of which the Holy Spirit is the third person. Yet, as with the revelation of the Son, knowledge of the Holy Spirit is given definitively in the fullness of time when God sent his Son. The New Testament tells us that the Angel Gabriel assures Mary that "the Holy Spirit will come upon you." At the time of Jesus' baptism by John, we are told that the Holy Spirit descended upon him like a dove. At one point, Jesus rejoices in the Holy Spirit when contemplating God's amazing work of salvation in which he hides things from the wise and learned "but reveals them to the childlike."

And now, on the cusp of his death, Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit will continue and extend the work of sanctification which he has inaugurated. The Holy Spirit, which descended upon the Church at Pentecost when the Apostles gathered in the Upper Room, makes Christ present in history until he comes again in glory. We see this on that day of Pentecost when the Spirit sets the Apostles on fire to proclaim Christ as the crucified and risen savior of the world. In the Acts of the Apostles, we see that the Spirit is accompanied by powerful signs such as speaking in tongues, healing of disease, and even the resuscitation of people from the dead. In all this, the Holy Spirit manifests divine power working in and through the human vessels of the apostles, giving credibility to their proclamation of Christ to Jews and pagans alike.

The Holy Spirit works in our age, too, to make present in the Church this credible witness to Christ. When the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine, they are transformed into the very body and blood of Christ himself. This act of calling the Holy Spirit, called the epiclesis, implies a

second event: the transformation of the entire community of believers assembled at the Eucharist in faith, that they too may be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit and so become "one body, one spirit in Christ."

The Holy Spirit raises up in every age powerful signs of the Church's identity as the body of Christ. In our time and place, members of Christ's faithful organize ministries to support pregnant women so that they choose life for their children AND to support migrants at the southern border. We have beautiful communities for the elderly poor, such as Holy Family Home in West Philadelphia, as well as schools for children of all ages, including schools of special education where children learn above all that they are loved by God. In these and so many other ways, our communities of faith demonstrate that we are so much more than a political party or an NGO—the Church is the body of believers called out of the world by the Holy Spirit to worship God and proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes again. Even today, amid all the uncertainties of our time, we have several members of our local community journeying in preparation to become Catholic. Even today, the Holy Spirit continues to draw men and women and "kindle in them the fire of [his] love."

Dear friends, I pray that each of us will call upon the Holy Spirit in our lives and respond to the promptings in our hearts, inviting us to a fuller participation in Christ's death and resurrection. In a particular way, I ask that you keep in prayer the members of our parish community preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this March. Veni, Sancte Spiritus!




