

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT



Dear Friends in Christ,

As we begin the Season of Lent, I would like to meditate on what it means to give alms, one of the three principal spiritual acts of Lent, along with prayer and fasting. At the end, I want to invite you to consider a specific kind of almsgiving: to the *Catholic Charities Appeal* of the Archdiocese. But first, I want to give a broader context about money, donations, and how almsgiving relates to prayer and fasting.

Almsgiving is a very specific kind of act. We often think of it as "donating money," almost like writing a check to an *alma mater*. But they're not the same thing. Supporting the work of the Church by the means at our disposal is a serious duty and a spiritual act that transcends the kind of cost-benefit analysis often used in the language of nonprofits.

We can look at the *Book of Genesis*, where Abraham gives Melchizedek a tenth of what he had. Melchizedek is a mysterious figure who prefigures Christ and the Eucharist in offering bread and wine in sacrifice to the one true God. Abraham, our father in faith, responds to Melchizedek's act by giving him a tenth of his goods. Why does he do this?

Abraham recognizes that Melchizedek is acting as a mediator between God and humanity. By offering the bread and wine, he is carrying out a priestly act. For this reason, the gift of a tenth of what Abraham has is really a gift to God, one given freely out of love. This gift, then, is a recognition that everything we have belongs to God; it is a sacrifice of earthly goods in response to the spiritual sacrifice of the priest.

That said, this means that the priest has the grave responsibility of using these goods properly and responsibly to fulfill his own needs and the needs of the poor.

Even today, all gifts to the Church—i.e., those given at the local parish—have this dual purpose: providing for the legitimate needs of the clergy and caring for the poor and those in need. In many cases, this takes the form of providing salaries for parish staff and school teachers who assist the clergy in their work. But even in the contemporary form, it's the same basic act: the parish priest in offering the Eucharist serves as mediator between the Blessed Trinity and the adopted children of God (all Christians); in return, those who come face-to-face with the risen Christ through this

action respond in various ways, including by offering some of their earthly goods so that the work of the Church can continue, including its care for the poor. Of course, anyone can care for the poor and those in need at any time. But, from the time of the apostles, Christians saw something good about a corporate, organized kind of charity overseen by the apostles in addition to individual and private forms of charity.

In the Middle Ages, there was a clear expectation about this gift: in the tradition of Abraham, families were asked to give 10% of their goods to the Church each year. These goods were often physical items such as livestock, grain, and land. If they chose to give via currency, they were supposed to give 12.5%. The secular government could even compel those who chronically neglected tithing to do so.

Why am I saying this? First of all, the support of the work of the Church is a spiritual act. It isn't just about "giving back," as nice as that sentiment is. Rather, it is about trusting that God will take care of us and always give us whatever we need to carry out the mission he entrusts to us. It's about recognizing that the Church is the world's greatest force for good. In addition to the infinite power of every Mass, the Catholic Church educates many children—including those in poverty, feeds the hungry, provides friendship for the homeless, and helps unwanted children to find loving homes. Has money given to the Church been used improperly at times? Absolutely. Do those of us in authority have a grave responsibility to be transparent about the use of these goods? You bet.

And yet, look at how our parish helps so many in need right now: with Christmas gifts, diapers for crisis pregnancy centers, and missionaries to proclaim the

Gospel near and far. Yes, tithing has tremendous spiritual benefits for those who give and receive such a gift. That is what God can do with our generosity.

That brings me to the Catholic Charities Appeal. Many of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy carried out in the name of the good people of the Archdiocese are funded through this annual appeal. Let's face it: while it would be great if I could be at the soup kitchens and family service centers all day or work with refugees and college students as a full-time ministry, I simply cannot do that. While all of us can give of ourselves in a few ways, we simply cannot be everywhere. But in a mysterious way, we can be if we support this work in other ways. Through a financial gift to the Catholic Charities Appeal, you really can be in a certain way with the poor, the needy, and those who

need to hear the Gospel. You can be there because in all those places we are there: that is, the collective we of the Church, locally constituted in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This is what giving alms means: supporting the poor who rely on the help of those who are able to assist them. It is, quite simply, one of the most important demands of the Christian life.

Our parish's goal for the appeal this year is \$126,000.

But I'm not worried about the actual number. We will surpass it. What is much more important is that in this season of Lent, each one of us takes a good, long look at our habits of spending, saving, and giving. What would our lives look like if we prioritized giving? If we really set 10% of our salary aside to support the work of the Church? Would our community be better or worse if our parish and the ministries of the Church had more opportunity to proclaim the Gospel and serve the least among us, the ones whom Jesus calls "my brothers" and says that whatsoever you do to them, you do to him?
