Dear Friends in Christ,

We are officially in the season of Carnivale, which means "farewell to meat" in Latin. In other words, these are the final weeks of preparation before the holy season of Lent, when faithful Christians from time immemorial have dedicated themselves to prayer, fasting, and works of charity. The reason these weeks became such a big party (epitomized in our country in New Orleans) was because the fasting laws were so strict in the past. While things have been loosened up over the years, some Catholics are rediscovering what taking Lent seriously can do for our spiritual lives.

In a particular way, we can unite with those members of our community who have been journeying for many months now to prepare for the Easter sacraments. Our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving should be in union with them and for their intentions in a particular way.

In that light, I'd like to highlight several special opportunities for spiritual growth this Lent:

Father Bob will host a **Lenten Discussion Group** on Pope Francis' new encyclical *Dilexit Nos* on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The group will meet each Wednesday during Lent at 10 a.m. in the Gathering Room. If you wish to register, please email us at events@stmarymagdalen.net to sign up!

I lead a **Bible Study for Young Adults** each Monday evening at 7 p.m. in Saint Francis Hall. Singles, newly married couples, and engaged couples are welcome to join us. For more information, please contact me at freric@stmarymagdalen.net.

Every Monday through Friday, we gather for **Morning Prayer** in the chapel at 7:15 a.m. Praying with the psalms is a great way to begin the day. During Lent, we will also offer Morning Prayer on Sundays at 8:30 a.m. in the chapel.

Stations of the Cross will take place each Friday during Lent at 7 p.m. (except on First Fridays, when it will be at 7:30 p.m.).

Finally, don't forget about **Confessions** every Saturday from 9 to 10 a.m. and Sunday from 6:15 to 6:45 p.m. Confessions are also available every First Friday during the 5:30 p.m. Holy Hour before 6:30 p.m. Mass. We will have additional opportunities during our **Advent Day of Mercy** on Monday, April 7th, as well as on Good Friday. *(continued)*

Looking at that list, you might say to yourself (as I did), 'wow, that's a lot of prayer!' And indeed, is that not our first priority? We have many good things to pray for—I mentioned our catechumens and candidates who are preparing to receive the Easter sacraments. However, we also have many young parishioners who will be confirmed on March 20th and others who will make their first communion at the beginning of the Easter Season. We also know the struggles that need prayer: for those who suffer depression, anxiety, and addiction; for refugees and those exiled from their homeland; for those who are sick; for those who have fallen away from the Church.

We all know there are many ways to pray. Over the next few weeks, I would like to examine several of them. The first is praying with the psalms.

The Church took from Judaism the practice of reciting the psalms daily. This praying of the Psalms found its way to the Liturgy of the Hours, which is prayed by Catholics to this day (see above, or page 2, for opportunities for Morning Prayer and Vespers).

Why pray with the psalms? Because they—like all Scripture—are inspired by the Holy Spirit. Sometimes—perhaps you've experienced this—when I try to pray, I often end up "thinking" instead of speaking and listening to God. We can get lost in our own thoughts. Even when we really address God in mental prayer, there is still a need to return to the prayers we learned as children (Saint Ignatius of Loyola always told those in contemplation to close with an 'Our Father'). The psalms work this way: they express the full range of human emotions and involve a Spirit-led dialogue with God. One never has to wonder, "am I thinking or praying here?"

Let me give you an example. *Psalm 62 (61*)*, prayed most Sundays and feast days, begins this way:

*O God, you are my God, for you I long
For you, my soul is thirsting
My body pines for you like a dry,*

*weary land without water
So I gaze on you in the sanctuary
To see you strength and your glory.*

Look at how evocative that prayer is! It is beautiful to meditate on the imagery: a soul that is thirsty, a body desiring God the way a dry land wants water. Remember the very dry autumn we just had? The grass was so brown, waiting for rain and moisture. We know that reality, so our hearts can comprehend this imagery, as well as the psalmist's solution to this holy longing: gazing upon the Lord in the sanctuary. Of course, in the psalm's original context, this was a Temple psalm, and the sanctuary was the holy of holies, the sacred inner space in the Temple where God dwelled spiritually with his people. This original context takes on a whole new meaning with the coming of Christ, in whom God dwells not just spiritually in a building but in flesh and blood before their eyes. In the Eucharist, reserved in the sanctuaries of our churches, Christ continues to dwell with his people in a substantial manner, the fulfillment of his promise to remain with us always.

While these meditations are beautiful, it is even more beautiful to pray them—to really mean them. If we truly express to God that our desire for him is like a dry land looking for water, will he not answer that prayer in a powerful way? Because of this, Christians since the time of the apostles have seen great value in praying the psalms. I hope you will find time to do so this Lent and beyond.

May the Lord grant you peace!



The 2025 Scholarship Deadline is March 15, 2025.

Dr. John J. and Dr. Margaret T. Clark were devoted members of St. Mary Magdalen Parish. The Clarks directed that a gift be made through their estate to endow scholarships for students who are members of Saint Mary Magdalen parish toward their post-secondary education.

Annually, one eligible student will be selected by the St. Mary Magdalen Scholarship Committee to receive a scholarship toward the first two (2) years of undergraduate tuition for their chosen college, university, or trade school. The annual scholarship amount is \$5,000 for up to two years. Eligible students must be active St. Mary Magdalen parish members and current high school seniors graduating in May or June of 2025.

This month, students in our school and PREP will practice the virtue of love of neighbor, or charity. This divinely infused virtue gives us the strength to love God above all things and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God. Students will practice the virtue of unselfish care and concern for others. We know Jesus calls us to love one another as He loves us, which means showing kindness, forgiveness, and compassion to everyone, even our enemies.

How can we embody this virtue in our family and community daily?

Practice Kindness: Always look for ways to help others, such as opening doors, sharing, and offering comforting words. **Forgiveness:** If someone hurts you, instead of holding a grudge, try to forgive them just as Jesus forgives you. **Empathy:** Try to understand how others feel by imagining yourself in their shoes. If someone is sad, what could you do to cheer them up? **Pray for Others:** Pray for your friends and those who might be challenging to love. Ask God to help you love them. **Avoiding Malice:** When you are angry or upset, take a moment to calm down before speaking or acting. Think of how you can respond with love instead of hurtful words or actions.


