Adoration & The Blessed Sacrament

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time



October 13, 2024



Dear Friends in Christ,

On the night before he died, Jesus gathered around him the Twelve who had followed him during his public ministry. They had witnessed the signs that no one else had ever seen; they heard his words about the Kingdom of God, which was even then being inaugurated. But on that night, gathered in a large, furnished upper room, Jesus anticipated and mysteriously began his own Passover by instituting the Eucharistic mystery, in which he handed on to the Church for all time his own body and blood, the "perpetual memorial of his passion and death."

Priests have the awesome and solemn duty of serving as custodians of the Eucharist. In fact, the proper stewardship of the mysteries which Christ handed on to the Church is one of the duties we promise to carry out on the day of ordination. This letter is written in this spirit and in recognition of the many graces that are pouring out across our country thanks to the Eucharistic Revival, which has taken place, including the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis this summer.

We have an incomparable treasure in our parish church; Christ dwells at all times among his people in the Blessed Sacrament. Our adoration chapel allows people to pray before the Blessed Sacrament almost all week, which is a beautiful gift I wish to continue and extend to the entire week. At this point, an important point should be made: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is something we can and should do whenever the consecrated hosts are present in the Tabernacle, often indicated by the presence of a burning candle. Exposition—either in the ciborium or in the monstrance—is by its nature a more solemn and, therefore, more public celebration of the Eucharistic presence of the Lord by a gathered assembly of the faithful. Sometimes, these terms are conflated, as if one cannot adore the Eucharistic Lord unless the consecrated host is exposed in the monstrance. That is simply not true.

The practice of extended exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is a uniquely special gift that, by its nature, involves an entire community. Even if, as is to be anticipated, large numbers of people cannot be present for this form of adoration at every moment, nevertheless, both as an expression of its corporate reality and for reasons of safety and avoidance of desecration, there must always be a few people there at all times when

exposition is taking place. The Church has laid down clearly that exposition may not occur unless at least two people are present. In addition, during Pope St. John Paul II's papacy, it was made clear that "the Most Holy Sacrament, when exposed, must never be left unattended even for the briefest space of time. It should therefore be arranged that at least some of the faithful always be present at fixed times, even if they take alternating turns" (*Instruction Redemptionis sacramentum* 138).

Reverence for the Eucharist means acknowledging and following the liturgical laws of the Church who is the guardian of the Church's tradition. Over the course of my first few months here, it has happened more frequently than I would like that I have come into the chapel and found no one there. This situation is at odds with both the spirit and the letter of the liturgical laws on this. When this happened, I spent a few minutes in the chapel.

Then, if no one arrives, I repose the Blessed Sacrament, which eventually creates confusion when someone wanders into the chapel and expects the Blessed Sacrament to be exposed.

To rectify this, I am asking all of you, our parish adorers, to re-commit yourselves to this ministry. Specifically, this commitment consists of:

- 1) spending one hour of adoration weekly (or additional hours if desired),
- 2) ensuring that a replacement is available if you are unable to make your scheduled time,
- 3) always signing in and out so we have a log of who has been in the chapel,
- 4) always remain in adoration during your designated time, even if another Mass or liturgy is taking place in the church.

We are asking for a six-month (re-)commitment, and of course, we would be delighted if you would choose to re-commit again after six months.

We will reach out to you again as it gets closer to the six-month mark.

Please sign the acknowledgment, including which adoration hours you are committing to, using the QR code to link to the electronic form and submit it to me by Friday, October 18th. Or, you can drop off a hard copy of the form to the parish office or rectory, which are available in the entrance to adoration.

As you know, we need a minimum of two adorers per hour in order to continue to offer solemn exposition in the monstrance at that time. Therefore, please encourage your friends and family to make this beautiful commitment as well, which they will not regret! At the same time, rest assured that while we work to secure two adorers for each hour, the chapel will remain open for adoration all week, even if exposition in the monstrance needs to be temporarily paused at certain times of the day.

I am grateful for your prayerfulness and your embrace of this critical ministry. May the Lord grant you peace!




