Dear Friends in Christ,

I write this letter filled with heartfelt gratitude to God and to everyone who was a part of last week's installation Mass. I think it was a special moment in the life of our parish—the Holy Spirit was truly present to us! We should be filled with gratitude for what the Lord has already done in our midst and be open to what he will continue to do. All we have to do is remain faithful, trusting that he is with us always.

I am also excited to officially announce what I mentioned during the Sunday Masses several weeks ago: Archbishop Pérez has assigned Reverend Robert A. Pesarchick as the new parochial vicar of Saint Mary Magdalen Parish. Father Pesarchick, or "Father Bob," has spent the last 24 years as a professor and academic dean at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary. He holds a doctorate in systematic theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome and was my teacher, formation advisor, and thesis advisor in the seminary. I am grateful to Archbishop Pérez for sending us another priest who will assist me a great deal in the sacramental care of our parishioners by assisting with Mass, Confession, funerals, the pastoral care of the sick, and other areas. I am particularly happy that he will share his great learning with our community both in homilies and in various adult faith formation initiatives. Welcome, Father Bob!

Today, we continue with the Creed, which speaks of Jesus as "conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary."

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—is the true solid rock upon which we can build our lives.

There is one part of the Creed in which we do something else—we bow, or on Christmas and the Feast of the Annunciation, we genuflect. We do this to acknowledge the part about Jesus' incarnation, the Word made flesh which dwelt among us. Indeed, the entrance of the Second Person of the Trinity into human history is the axis on which the world turns.

All time and all the tangled events of history find their resolution and significance in the light of Jesus' descent among us, his people. This is true in a very literal sense, as our calendars orient time with Christ at the central point of history—everything that happened before is one era, and everything since is another.

The Creeds speak of the incarnation as a Trinitarian act. God sends the Son into the world in the fullness of time, and he is "conceived by the Holy Spirit." This recognition of Jesus' singularly miraculous birth is not meant in any way to denigrate the beauty of marriage or the natural means of procreating children in the world. Indeed, this is a part of God's plan for humanity and is to be seen as good and holy. Rather, this teaching is founded on a deeper reality: that from all eternity, God dwells securely as a communion of love among the three persons. Jesus' origin, then, is not found in humanity but in the divine life of God. Jesus is God's Son, first and foremost, from all eternity. For this reason, his conception in time takes place through the action of the Holy Spirit, who makes Christ present in the world even today through the sacraments. Jesus' incarnation is extended into our time in and through the sacraments; therefore, we can catch a glimpse of what it means for his human conception to be a Spirit-initiated event. In other words, human ingenuity and wisdom had nothing to do with it, in the same way that my virtue or ability has nothing to do with the transformation of the bread and wine into Christ's own body and blood.

Yet, Jesus is the Word made flesh. What is so remarkable about this - what makes us bow down in awe—is that despite Jesus' Divine origin, humanity is made a willing cooperator in his work of redemption from the very beginning. God does not force himself upon his creatures, even to save us from sin, suffering, and death. Instead, as always, he treats us as free creatures, places himself before us, and demands a response. In Mary, the ever-Virgin Mother of God, this assent to God's plan was

given on behalf of us all. The appearance of the angel Gabriel announces to her before any other human creature the plan of salvation which God was carrying out. The angel waits for Mary's fiat, her yes to God's plan, because love always waits for the response of the beloved. And so, she says yes, "let it be done to me according to your word." From that moment on, we can speak of the Son of God incarnate, the Son who exists from all eternity yet who now has begun to exist in time. Now he also has a human origin story, as the entire history of Israel presents to us—with all the checkered history we find in the Old Testament! Now, he even has a human father. Not, of course, in the biological or natural sense, but Joseph, the legal father of Jesus who raises him as his own, really does carry out an essential part of God's plan as he protects Jesus and his Mother in those treacherous early months and years and leads them in the quiet, unassuming home of Nazareth.

How much is contained, then, in these little words "conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary." Because of them, our own human dignity has been restored, and we can once again be heirs of Divine life through baptism. I pray that all of us will meditate on this dogma of the Church for ourselves and then share it with others, especially those who doubt God's love for them or his power to transform human affairs.






