Dear Friends in Christ,

As we bask in the glow of an Eagles' Superbowl victory, I want to give a few reminders and an appeal for assistance. First, remember our parish's First Friday devotions, which begin at 5:30 p.m. on the first Friday of each month with a Eucharistic Holy Hour. We have beautiful music accompanying the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, along with an opportunity for the Sacrament of Penance, concluding with Vespers. Then, at 6:30 p.m., we have Mass, followed by a pizza reception. Please join us as you can for these prayerful and contemplative evenings.

In addition, we have a solid group who gather every Monday through Friday at 7:15 a.m. in the chapel to pray Morning Prayer. Praying the Psalms really helps us start our days off well. I encourage you to give it a try, especially if you are looking to pray more as we approach the Season of Lent.

It can be easy for us to think of the word "repent" as merely confessing major sins and receiving forgiveness from God. And while that is an important aspect, it only captures one dimension of that word. Repentance is not something we can permanently accomplish in this life. It is a continual, Spirit-led movement out of the darkness of sin, suffering, and death and into the life of the Triune God, a life which must, of necessity, imbue every aspect of our lives. That's the problem with that reductionist view of repentance: it sometimes fools us into thinking that repentance is something those people have to do. Actually, it is something all of us must do.

In the *Book of Genesis*, God creates the whole universe out of nothing, in a gratuitous act of love. He placed the man and the woman at the pinnacle of creation and settled them in the garden—in other words, they had everything they needed to be happy. But with that covenant came a command not to eat of the fruit of one of the trees, the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. This command, because of the effects of original sin in us, strikes us as irksome and arbitrary. But the man and the woman—created free from sin—would have experienced it as a gift by which they came to know how to live in the image and likeness of God. And how was that life to be lived? In the first place, by fasting—not from everything, but simply from that one fruit on that one tree. In learning to say no to themselves, they learn to trust God. They were being taught their dependence on him and his love for them. God will give us what we need, and he will not give us what we don't need; not everything that appears good to us will actually make us happy, at least at that moment.

But in their rebellion, they decided that they knew better than God. They chose not to serve, not to receive, but to have whatever they wanted whenever they wanted it. But they discovered that such a life turns us in upon ourselves. Their choice not to fast leads to their estrangement from God and division right at the heart of the human family. Man becomes a mystery unto himself, no longer capable of the easy delight in God that he possessed in the beginning. In that small act of grasping at the apple lies the pattern of all our human sins: we grasp at what we want, what appears good for us. But often enough, it leaves us empty and alone. Only the redeeming power of Christ can free us from this prison. In the Sacrament of Baptism, the light of faith pierces through the darkness of our self-assertion and places us back in a filial relationship with God our Creator, who in

Christ Jesus we dare to call "Our Father." Made one in Christ through Baptism, we are filled with the Holy Spirit, who undertakes the amazing work of making us like God himself. This process of deification culminates in the glory of heaven, but it is present to us now while we are on pilgrimage on earth. But it involves, as it did for Christ himself, a willingness to suffer and to love one another in his sacrificial manner.

The Church has always taken it as a divine mandate that all the faithful are obligated to do penance. Priests and those in the vowed life of poverty, chastity, and obedience are called to this in a particular way, but the obligation nevertheless extends to all.

As you know, the Church sets aside every Friday as a day of penance. The universal law of the Church sets a minimum for this day: abstinence from meat.

Now, in the United States, the bishops decided sixty years ago that abstinence from meat was only mandatory on Fridays of Lent, and that another form of penance could be chosen outside of Lent if necessary. But what matters—as with everything in the life of grace—is both our hearts' exterior actions and interior disposition. The point of external penance is to be united interiorly with Christ in his suffering and through him all those who suffer. In the Middle Ages, people would fast and give the food they would usually have eaten to the poor. I think we should do the same thing. Fasting from food or drink or *Netflix* or whatever doesn't just unite us to Christ and make us more spiritually attuned: it places more money in our pockets that we can use to help those who are poor. If everyone in our parish skipped one meal a week and gave the money to the poor, what a profound impact that would have on our community and ourselves, whom Christ wishes to mold more perfectly into himself.



Dr. John J. and Dr. Margaret T. Clark were devoted members of St. Mary Magdalen Parish. The Clarks directed that a gift be made through their estate to endow scholarships for students who are members of Saint Mary Magdalen parish toward their post-secondary education.

Annually, one eligible student will be selected by the St. Mary Magdalen Scholarship Committee to receive a scholarship toward the first two (2) years of undergraduate tuition for their chosen college, university, or trade school. The annual scholarship amount is \$5,000 for up to two years. Eligible students must be active St. Mary Magdalen parish members and current high school seniors graduating in May or June of 2025.


